Peter has had a variety of careers including teacher, public servant, consultant, and volunteer in international programs. He is a member of the Board of PASCAL and was a member of the Australian Delegation to OECD in Paris for three years. He has had a long interest in learning cities in Australia and internationally and was the founder of the PASCAL PIE Program which provided for exchanges of experience between learning cities around the world. Peter developed the PASCAL EcCoWell program directed at integrated and holistic approaches to

building learning cities He was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in 2006, and in 2021 became a Member of the Order of Australia for his contribution to education and lifelong learning in Australia and internationally.

She has worked in education and community development including in Australia, Japan, France, Denmark, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Mexico, and Bolivia.
